As a business we have a duty to ensure that any waste we produce is handled safely and within the law. This is our 'duty of care'. It applies to anyone who produces, imports, transports, stores, treats or disposes of controlled waste from business or industry. Commercial, industrial and household wastes (including hazardous/special wastes) are classified as 'controlled waste'

We only pass our waste to authorised organisations.

This document aims to provide a strategic context for MDTi's various waste-related activities and plans, which embrace waste planning, disposal and minimisation. We aim to contribute to a safer, cleaner and healthier environment, and help to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the light of rising concerns over climate change.

We comply with The Packaging (Essential Requirements) (Amendment) Regulations 2009, The Waste Management (England and Wales) Regulations 2011 and EU 94/62/EC Directive on packaging and packaging waste.

We constantly monitor our waste processes in order to improve the environment and reuse or recycle as much waste as possible and where necessary will find a suitably certified organisation to deal with it. We will also try to ensure we use products in packaging that can be recycled or reused efficiently as much as is possible.

We will segregate different wastes as appropriate and ensure we have adequate storage facilities where necessary.

Training on waste is dealt within the section for the Environmental Management System within the Induction process and staff are fully informed of any changes in legislation or improvements in targets on reuse or any other relevant information via a notice board sited in the office or via team meetings.
